- Amazon Wildfires Response: Brazil faces its worst drought in 70 years, triggering wildfires across the Amazon basin. Learn about efforts to combat these fires and their impact on the environment and air quality.
- Africa's Miombo Initiative: Protecting 469 million acres of Miombo Woodlands, a critical carbon storage and biodiversity hub supporting 300 million people.

- IPLCs: In 2022 at COP15 in Montreal, 200 countries adopted the Kunming-Montreal Global Biodiversity Framework, targeting the protection of 30% of the world's lands and waters by 2030. A key takeaway was that Indigenous Peoples and local communities must lead these efforts, as they manage almost 50% of the world's land and protect 80% of its biodiversity, despite comprising only about 6% of the global population.
